

TCSS FIRE MITIGATION POLICY

(Updated December 2024)

General Information

- *Firefighting equipment is located in the 100-yard range shelter: shovels, rakes, and fire extinguishers
- *No tracer or incendiary ammunition, or exploding targets/Tannerite of any kind are allowed
- *Shooters will be extra vigilant during Orange and Red Flag Warning Days and Stage 1 and 2 fire bans
- *Smoking allowed only in designated area
- *No fires are allowed anywhere on range property

Orange and Red Flag Warning Days

Per the current Teller County Fire Ban Guide, recreational shooting at the GCSSC is allowed with caution.

Stage 2 Fire Ban

Per the current Teller County Fire Ban Guide, recreational shooting at the GCSSC is allowed with caution.

Stage 3 Fire Ban

The GCSSC will be fully CLOSED. TCSS will communicate the fire ban status to all members via e-mail both when the range is closed and then reopened and the website will be updated. The Range Manager or member of the TCSS Board of Directors will lock the gate to prevent access by anyone until the Stage 3 fire ban is reduced or lifted.
